Allowances

If any all purpose allowances apply (marked *), they should be added to the minimum rate before penalties and overtime are calculated.

Allowances	Rate
* Industry allowance - other than tile factories (already included in the rate tables above)	\$0.60 per hour
* Industry allowance - tile factories (already included in the rate tables above)	\$0.40 per hour
Bituminous sprayer allowance	\$0.60 per hour or part of an hour while doing that work
Boot allowance	\$3.20 per week to buy the boots
Clothing allowance	\$2.60 per week to buy the clothing
Distant work - board and lodging	\$85.59 per day for the first 7 days and \$598.82 for any extra week or part thereof
Distant work - fares reimbursement	reimbursement for all reasonable travel fares to the distant work
Epoxy based materials allowance	\$0.93 per hour or part of an hour while doing that work
First aid allowance	\$3.02 per day
Fork-lift operators allowance	\$0.13 per hour up to a maximum of \$4.86 per week
Leading hand allowance - in charge of less than 3 employees	\$0.58 per hour up to a maximum of \$21.86 per week payment in addition to the minimum wage for the highest classification supervised, or own minimum wage, whichever is higher
Leading hand allowance - in charge of 3 to 6 employees	\$0.75 per hour up to a maximum of \$28.64 per week payment in addition to the minimum wage for the highest classification supervised, or own minimum wage, whichever is higher
Leading hand allowance - in charge of more than 6 employees	\$0.91 per hour up to a maximum of \$34.67 per week payment in addition to the minimum wage for the highest classification supervised, or own minimum wage, whichever is higher
Loss of clothing reimbursement	reimbursement for destroyed clothing up to a maximum of \$746.90
Meal allowance - overtime	\$16.09 for the first and subsequent meals during overtime and any meals provided by the employee themselves if overtime has been cancelled or shortened
Protective clothing reimbursement	reimbursement for the cost of suitable boots and waders, waterproof overcoat and sou'wester'
Sandblasting allowance	\$0.93 per hour or part of an hour while doing that work
Tools reimbursement	reimbursement for tools and gloves
Transfer from job to job	payment at the minimum hourly rate of pay (including any relevant all purpose allowance) for time spent in travel
Working in and out of tanks allowance	\$0.60 per hour with a minimum payment of 4 hours
